#### **UPDATE FROM THE CLUB CHAIRMAN**



Our brand new all-red Beaconsfield Town kit, manufactured by Macron and sponsored by Hearthstone Mortages.

We had over 530 registered players for the 2023/24 season, record numbers by a considerable margin. Highlights included:

- Fielding an expanded set of boys' teams that made us the biggest boys' club in South Bucks.
- Further developing our girls' teams, with squads in three age groups and plans to grow this significantly further next season.
- Introducing a new 'community' adult team to run alongside the existing First Team and U23 squads.

#### For last season, key steps forward included:

- We moved to a single kit (Beaconsfield Town's smart all-red strip) with a single badge - helping to increase visibility of support for 'The Rams' Beaconsfield and the surrounding areas.
- Our younger age groups had the chance to be mascots at home matches with the Beaconsfield Town FC team, a great experience for them all.
- · Our junior and youth teams had greater access to the Holloways Park facilities and 3G pitch for training, a summer tournament, the annual Awards day and holiday soccer camps.

We have had considerable playing successes over the season and in the summer tournaments, as you will read in this newsletter. We are equally proud though of our consistently good performance in the Fair Play feedback, with two teams getting the highest scores in their divisions and all teams well in the top half. Above all, we celebrate our inclusive, community feel; the club gives local players of all abilities the chance to learn the game we love and make lifelong friends from across the community.

Meanwhile, off the field the exciting news was our successful appeal with Inland Homes to get planning permission for our exciting new home at Glory Hill – replacing our Wilton Park pitches, but fully owned by the Club, with a small clubhouse and changing facilities and onsite parking. Close to the Wooburn Green Lane council pitches that we also use, this will provide the Youth Club with a real centre of gravity and long term security.

Although Inland Homes have now gone into administration, their business interests at Wilton Park/Glory Hill have now been taken over by Brookfield Developments who have reconfirmed their commitment to the Glory Hill project. Developing the site will probably take 18 to 24 months and so we will continue to use Wilton Park in the meantime, but our own core home is now within touching distance.

Everything we do depends on the commitment and goodwill of our army of volunteer coaches and administrators, who give up their free time to run training sessions, supervise squads at matches and provide the necessary logistical support. Thank you to all of them for the great work!

## CHILD WELFARE UPDATE

#### CLARE O'FARRELL

The 23/24 season has once again run smoothly thanks to the valued support of over 100 parents who volunteer their time to manage and coach teams, oversee team admin/communications and referee/run the line. We have seen an additional 30 volunteers join us this season and a further 15 are undergoing checks and training ready for a September start. It has certainly been a busy season managing all their DBS checks and training requirements, whilst ensuring our Club is operating with children's safety and enjoyment of football as its number one priority. I regularly attend virtual meetings with the Safequarding Team at Berks & Bucks FA and the number of complaints they have to investigate weekly from Clubs, parents, and players about bad behaviour sadly continues to rise. Thank you to all those who set a good example to our players, ensuring that our Committee rarely has any complaints to investigate.

This season I organised an in-person First Aid training session following feedback that the mandatory FA online First Aid training wasn't particularly useful for day-to-day football injuries. Thank you to Andy Batchelor (U8 Parent) and his colleagues from South Central Ambulance Service who delivered a fun, informative and interactive training session at Holloways Park for a group of our coaches.

It covered how to deal with more serious incidents like cardiac arrest including how to use a defibrillator along with sprains, brakes, cuts and head injuries that we see more regularly. Another will take place early in the new season - details to follow.

For coaches, please can I encourage you to continue sharing ideas/knowledge across our coach network using the dedicated WhatsApp group. Your experience, especially those who've been doing it for several years, is invaluable. For parents of players who may be interested in getting more involved or starting/adding to their existing FA training, please do get in touch. The Club will reimburse you for any training costs incurred.

Lastly please ensure you have my contact details noted should you need to report any safeguarding concerns going forward.

#### U7s - Tim Howmann

Our U7 boys have had a great season. We have approximately 26 children who have really thrown themselves into the training sessions and all of our matches. We have seen such an improvement in them all across the season, showing some great skill, passion and commitment. #### **U14 Athletic - Gary Partridge**

We had a squad of 19 boys this year, successfully integrating several new players. We moved our training to a Monday evening and attendance was very good. We continued going in to match days with a squad of 16 and that had its challenges, towards the end of the season we opted to rotate the squad a bit more and have fewer substitutes.

A lot like the previous season we started the season ok with some hard-fought victories, we had to contend with a sticky patch mid-season before closing out the season winning 3 of our last 5 fixtures.
