Current Status from the Chairman

Wilton Park Update

 Inland Homes are yet to submit their formal planning application to build 350 houses on Wilton Park and have verbally confirmed that we can continue to use the site for another season at least. We continue to work with Inland Homes to discuss our longer-term future at Wilton Park; in the meantime, we are actively exploring possible alternatives for the long-term home of our growing club.

Beaconsfield Sycob Update

• Over the last few years, we have been steadily increasing our collaboration with Beaconsfield Sycob - for example, using The Meadow for our U7s-U1os' matches, hosting our Awards Day ceremony at the Holloways Park stadium and developing our highly successful Summer Tournament there. Next season, our collaboration reaches the next stage with them changing their name to Beaconsfield Town FC, thereby creating a single 'brand' to represent football in the town all the way from U6s/7s to adults; we are also developing a single website (with clear Adult and Junior sections) to provide a focal point for communication and media. The two clubs will continue to be run as separate administrative and financial entities, but with close interaction, to our mutual benefit. So if anyone is ever at a loose end on a Saturday, do please go and watch our 'new' Adult team!

CURRENT INITIATIVES

Beaconsfield Sycob FC

•We continue to build stronger relationships with the owners of Beaconsfield Sycob who currently play in Division 1 Central of the Southern League (Level 8 of the league hierarchy) with the long term aim of providing players with a route and the opportunity to play and train with semi-professionals whilst under 18.

They will change their name next season to Beaconsfield Town FC which has been approved by the Football Association but the junior club will continue to operate as a legally and financially separate entity.

Wycombe Wanderers FC

Our second year joint training camp with WWFC was the highest attended in the area and we plan to hold 2 more camps later in 2017. We will inform everybody about the proposed half term and summer dates as soon as they are confirmed.

This will be a fantastic opportunity for our young footballers to be trained by the best coaches in the area and a chance to recruit new players across the younger age groups.

Beaconsfield Town FC day at Wycombe Wanderers

30 of our U7s, U8s and U9s were invited by Wycombe Wanderers to become flag bearers for their game against Barnet FC last October. The boys and their coaches Neil, Ben and Mick had an excellent day and were warmly applauded by the 3000 crowd during their lap of honour at half time.



Goalkeeper Training

The club hired a qualified goalkeeping coach from the AJD Academy to provide over 20 budding goalkeepers from all age groups with monthly specialist training. The feedback has been excellent and club will continue with this investment next season.

Futsal Training

Futsal football was introduced to our U8 to U13 teams by qualified Futsal coaches. This style of football is rapidly growing in the UK and is well established in countries like Brazil and Spain. It ultimately teaches the players to be comfortable in possession whilst looking to pass and move.

FA Skills Courses

We have been fortunate to have had free Football Association coaches provide us with four FA skills training sessions in 2016 for most of our teams in the half term and summer breaks.

U10 Chris Smith (Reds/Blues), Duncan Jones (Colts) & David Bocquet (Yellows)

The Under 10's have had another very enjoyable and successful season. With 48 players registered, this season we took the decision to field two full squads and a "buddy" team (buddied with Seer Green) so that we could give regular playing time to all the boys and girls. And we now have 6 coaches who turn up rain or shine (and I think have all turned up at least once even when their respective child is not playing!) So many thanks to the coaches (Felice, Rob, Duncan, Stuart and David). We have tried to make the emphasis on enjoyment and camaraderie (many of the group have now been together for at least 3 years), but also can't ignore competitive streak that runs through our age group (the coaches included!)

The U10 Reds / Blues squad have had another great season in the top division of their league. Overall, they won 5 fixtures, drew 7 and lost 5, scoring 127 goals in the process. Whilst they probably drew too many matches, they did prove generally hard to beat (reflected in the fact that the joint players of the season are both defenders – Georgie Lloyd and Mattias Gianneri) and have definitely narrowed the gap to the supposed top couple of teams in the division. For me, the highlight of the season was drawing the home fixture with Cookham (2 wins, 2 defeats), a fixture in which historically we have never registered even a drawn match! It has been extremely rewarding to watch the kids develop their passing game, and many of the best goals of the season have come from flowing passing moves involving multiple players. We will continue to encourage this next season as we move to the 9-a-side format on bigger pitches. Well done to all the kids – they are a pleasure to coach and we are already looking forward to coaching them again next season!

And some great breaking news: we won the Chinnor tournament so have some silverware to show for the season!!

The U10 Colt's season was a tale of two halves. We began the season in the blue division, and after losing a match in week 2, we had an unbeaten run through to end of October, which led to our second promotion in two seasons - so far, so good. After reaching the heady heights of the green league, our learning curve grew ever steeper. An early draw was followed by a serious of heavy losses as we adjusted to the ability, speed and determination of our new opponents. As the season progressed, we got better and began to compete, and the players really raised their game. It was rewarding to see the improvement in the players, and the gelling of the team, and we're all looking forward to the new season.

The U10Yellow buddy squad were not the most successful of teams in terms of results but that was never really the point. We played a huge amount of competitive football in a league full of very serious teams. The team improved noticeably through the season by sticking to a few simple strategies and putting in allot of good old fashioned hard work. If one thing held us back from achieving our full potential it was a lack of firepower up front. We had some big losses but also some famous wins, including a penalty shootout demolition of Seer Green, and a stunning 9-1 destruction of Thame Tigers. Two draws against the very talented Bedgrove Dynamo team were also well deserved. Yellows were a team without attitude and superstars, but with a lot of goodwill and good humour (I was asked once what my tactics would be if a player brought a chainsaw onto the pitch).

They are a great bunch of kids, all with superfriendly parents, and I hope to see them all again next year.

U11 Holger Beyer, Steve Potts, Simon Johnson, Peter Coates, Bikram Aulja

The U11's moved up to playing 9-a-side this season, with off-side, bigger pictures, bigger goals and big ambitions.

We wanted all of our 37 players to get as many games as possible and decided to register three teams with the South Bucks League. This required a considerable number of volunteers to discover their passion for coaching youth football and we preyed on five Dads, who quickly rose to the challenge. Elaborate cone displays were soon confusing airline pilots and conversation rarely strayed from the nuances of 3-5-2 versus 4-4-2. If you are now wondering how you can play either formation in a 9-a-side game, please let us know once you have worked it – we are still trying to figure it out.

We were very lucky to have a professional goal keeping coach join our coaching team. Doing special training for the keepers every week gives us a real edge against other teams.

And now a quick summary of how each team did, as seen by its coaches:

Beaconsfield Town set itself the objective of playing, acting and thinking as a team. The boys had a strong season and won more games than they lost, at times playing some very nice football. They qualified for the league final, which made for an exciting day out for the boys, their parents and 5,000 travelling supporters. We were beaten by a very strong Bourne End side, but the boys and their parents should be very proud of how they played throughout the whole season.

The Beaconsfield Athletic team had a good season, with all the boys learning and developing well - both individually and as a team

Results were generally good, with one or two exceptions to prove the rule! It was a pleasure for us to see the boys' progress, often playing good football and scoring some great goals.

The boys also did well in our tournament at SYCOB, beating some very strong teams' enroute to the semi-final where we couldn't quite muster the win. Nonetheless the boys did themselves proud, playing expansive football and also defending resolutely where required. Overall, a fitting end to a successful season.

The United squad came together for the first time in September, including a number of players who were new to the club. We played against some strong teams in the Black league, many of which were from clubs with only 2 squads, and some teams which were subsequently promoted to the next league.

Our squad pulled together throughout the season to show resilience in each game, and to keep trying harder for every next game, and we really enjoyed seeing the significant improvement both in the individual players and in their team-work.

They should all be proud of their effort, resilience, and improvement over the season, and I hope to see them all continue to improve next season.

U12 Michael Reyner / Leon Rasenberg

Our U12 FC team have performed terrifically in the Red (top) division of the South Bucks Mini Soccer League, winning 14 out of 16 games in the regular season (scoring 58 goals and only conceding 19). They deservedly finished top of the League in the competitive part of the season but were edged out 3-2 by Marlow in the League Final at Thame. Their excellent results have continued into the summer tournaments, with an agonising penalty shootout defeat in the final of our own tournament.

We are not the biggest team physically but the boys compete really well, pass the ball incisively and have pace in all the key positions. Next year will see the big step-up to 11-a-side but the boys are looking forward to it and continue to progress well; they are a polite and friendly group and a pleasure to coach.

There is still a lot more to come from these boys as they start to fully develop a competitive edge to their game and we look forward to the challenge of moving to 11 a side fully competitive matches next season.

They have been a fantastic and committed group and I look forward to coaching them all again next season as we strive to win our first trophies that they have deserved for their overall play over the past year or so.

The U13's this year combined two squads into one for this season. This meant we had a wide range of skills, all playing in one team, which can be a problem.

The boys are a pleasure to coach and immediately forged a united squad, involving everyone. All 18 boys played and contributed towards the team.
